Re: Per capita contributions

Dear Friends in Christ,

As you know, the presbyteries, synods, and General Assembly of our Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) annually make assessments that, in our presbytery, total \$45.10 per member. Homestead Presbytery is committed to paying the assessment for all our members because we treasure our relationship with the wider church. We firmly believe our congregations and the Presbytery's mission benefits when members contribute their share to the whole.

Why do we pay this assessment known as per capita? Because we value our Presbyterian heritage and identity. As a congregation we derive many material benefits from our Presbyterian association. At the General Assembly level, these include the oversight of preparation for ministers and the mechanisms for calling new ministers, the maintenance of the wonderful Presbyterian historical collection in Philadelphia, the biennial meeting of the General Assembly, resources ranging from training for ruling elders to assistance with immigration, and so much more. The Synod of Lakes and Prairies provides leadership training for COM members, boundary training for all pastors and Presbytery leaders, facilitates Presbytery events such as the Day of Discernment held earlier this year, human resource payroll and benefits administration, and many more services. The Presbytery portion enables support of our mission through: Calvin Crest Camp and Conference Center; sending youth and adults to the Presbyterian Youth Triennium; the work of Homestead's newly formed Disaster Response Team; the Programs and Grants Committee that provides funding for shared mission opportunities and scholarship/grant assistance for church leaders and members; Committee on Ministry work with transitions in congregations, assistance

to Pastor Nominating Committees; exciting new opportunities for churches and leaders to explore your congregations vitality and vibrancy; salary and benefits for the Presbytery Staff-Executive Presbyter, Administrative Assistant, Stated Clerk, and Treasurer; and a multitude of connections and services.

But it is not these benefits alone that make us so deeply committed to the per capita offering. It is our shared sense of our Reformed heritage and our Presbyterian identity that compels us to take our covenantal relationship with the whole Presbyterian family so seriously.

Thank you for what you are doing to support the ministry and mission of Christ's church all around the world, including right here in Nebraska! We look forward to your participation in per capita giving, an expression of your commitment to ministry both within our congregation and beyond.


